A NOTE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

In 2024, we served a record number of children and families — over 2,000 individuals in nearly 700 households, which is three times as many as we served in 2023. This reflects both the growing need for our services, as more families with children are experiencing housing instability and homelessness, and our increased capacity to serve those families, thanks to the generosity of our community supporters.

On Maui, we quickly grew our team to serve hundreds of families affected by the 2023 wildfires, who are still seeking permanent housing on their journey to recovery. And on O'ahu, we opened our first two 'Ohana Navigation Centers, which provide a holistic solution to preventing and ending homelessness for families and represent the culmination of the knowledge we've gained over the past two decades. Each Center provides families with a safe place to sleep; support to navigate their challenges and find housing, through our on-site case management; and communal space for families to build community with our volunteers and partners. Each of the Centers has continuously been at capacity since they opened.

We also updated our mission statement: "To transform the lives of families with children in Hawai'i facing homelessness by providing housing, resources, and support." It doesn't reflect a change in priorities; instead, as we enter our 20th anniversary year in 2025, we feel it better reflects the services we offer and gets more at the heart of what we've always done at Family Promise: transform lives. This is only possible because of generous and dedicated supporters like you — thank you for transforming the lives of Hawai'i's keiki for years to come.

UNVEILING THE 'OHANA NAVIGATION CENTERS



'Ohana Navigation Center Mō'ili'ili

'Ohana Navigation Center Wahiawā

Family Promise's of Hawai'i's 'Ohana Navigation Centers are all-in-one facilities that prevent and end homelessness for families with children. Launched in 2024, this innovative model combines FPH's core services under one roof for the first time, including:

- Interim housing, providing emergency shelter for families experiencing homelessness up to 20 individuals (5-6 families) in Mo'ili'ili and 48 individuals (12 families) in Wahiawa
- On-site case management, wraparound services, and connections to housing resources
- Space for **community partners and volunteers**, including our weekly 'Ohana Nights, where volunteers provide meals and activities for families, and on-site resources like the Dept. of Education

Each family has their own private room and bathroom, and there are shared kitchen and laundry facilities at each building, along with computers, food pantries, supplies, and other basic needs. FPH continues to serve families of any size and composition — including single moms, single dads, two-parent households, and multigenerational families — keeping them together in their time of need.

2024 HIGHLIGHTS

INTERIM HOUSING



Our Interim Housing program provides emergency shelter for families experiencing homelessness. Each family has an individual unit, providing a safe, stable place to stay as they work to get back into permanent housing. Families are provided with personal hygiene items, food, transportation, and comprehensive case management at no cost. In 2024, we served 151 individuals in 44 families.

As the number of families experiencing homelessness grows, we found innovative ways to increase the number of families we can serve. Thanks to the commitment of our team and community partners, we increased our space to accommodate 24 families – double the amount compared to 2023.

EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE

We provide various forms of emergency rental assistance. For families at risk of homelessness, we provide short-term rental assistance to prevent them from losing their housing. For families experiencing homelessness, we provide rental assistance that can prevent them from entering the shelter system, help them get back into housing faster, and for those with a disability, sustain their housing long-term. In 2024, we provided emergency rental assistance to 461 individuals in 120 families.



DISASTER CASE MANAGEMENT



On Maui, we provide comprehensive case management for survivors of the 2023 Maui wildfires, which includes helping families find long-term housing, connections to additional support services, and advocacy for survivors' needs. In 2024, this program served 1,432 individuals in 530 families.



VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT





For the past five years, Marissa has been a dedicated and inspiring part of our Family Promise 'ohana. Volunteering has always been a meaningful part of her life — rooted in the values of her family and community. What keeps her coming back is the deep sense of connection and inspiration she finds among other volunteers.

Marissa formerly worked at FPH and co-founded the beloved 'Ohana Nights program alongside volunteers Jessica and Sandy. Today, the program continues to thrive thanks to Marissa's continued support — now as a volunteer — along with Jessica and hundreds of other Family Promise volunteers!

One of Marissa's most heartwarming memories was an 'Ohana Nights outing to Dave and Buster's. Leading up to the evening, one mom said that her kids were on their best behavior, determined not to miss the special day. Once they were there, Marissa recalled that one boy kept saying, "I can't believe this is happening! It's like a dream!"


